FARMERS SAVE LABOR

By use of labor-saving equipment, farmers now produce more with less work than formerly, reports C. H. Bingham, Penn State extension agricultural engineer. Chores still take a lot of time but they, too, can be streamlined by revising the routine.

RENOVATE POOR PASTURES

Very poor pastures can be improved by applying a ton or two of lime, tearing up the old sod with a heavy tractor disk or bush-and-log harrow, explains J. B. R. Dickie, extension agronomist of the Pennsylvania State College. Apply the fertilizer and sow grass and legume seed in the spring.

START BUILT-UP LITTER

The best time to start built-up litter in the poultry house is when the pullets are brought in from the range, reminds F. H. Leuschner, extension poultry specialist of the Pennsylvania State College.

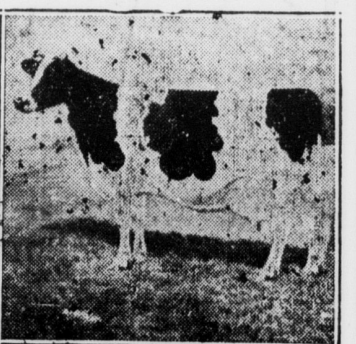

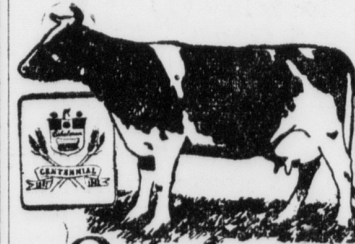
