## AUTO CLUB WILL EXPAND SCHOOL SAFETY PROGRAM

With motor traffic steadily in- creasing in volume and the need for driver and pedestrian caution growing greater each day the safety education program in the schools of Lancaster city and county, inaugurated nearly a quarter century ago, will be extended during the 1948-49 term.

As in previous years, the Lan- caster Automobile Club is sponsor- ing the project, with the co-opera- tion of school authorities and State and local police. The program in- cludes safety patrol operation and pedestrian safety education in the elementary schools and driver in- struction and training in the high schools.

At the opening of the new term AAA safety patrols swung into ac- tion at more than 200 city and county schools, all equipped with regulation white belts and official badges supplied by the auto club.

The 1948-49 program includes plans to enlarge the patrol organi- zation to cover all of the one-room and two-room schools along main and secondary highways in Lan- caster County. All of the larger public and parochial schools, and many of the rural schools, now have safety patrols.

Five high schools have driver training courses, using AAA dual control cars supplied through ar- rangements made by the auto club, and others are planning similar courses. Those in operation are McCaskey High School, Columbia High School, Millersville - Manor Township High School, Manheim Borough High School and Denver High School. In addition, a course for teachers is given at Millers- ville Teachers College, with an AAA dual control car in use for behind-the-wheel training.

AAA posters, safety lessons and other material are furnished schools each month. Safety motion pictures will be shown the schools, including a film in color of the safety parade held in Lancaster last May.
