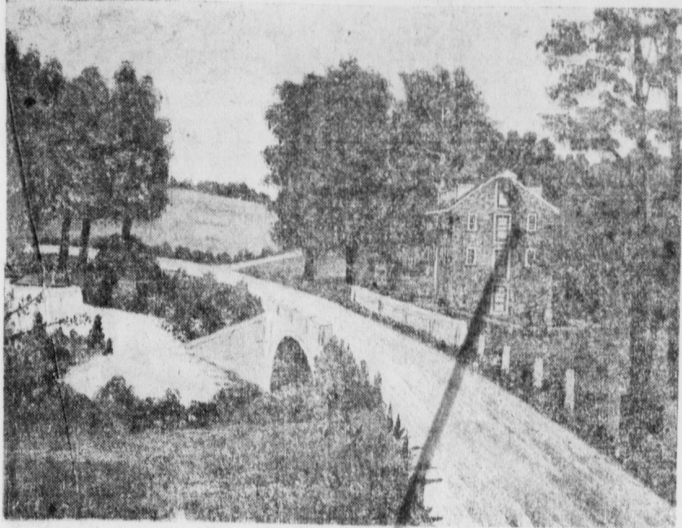


Display of Oil Paintings Church Notes

The Mount Joy Community Exhibit will again include a large display of oil paintings by Lineaus W. Longenecker, R. F. D. 2, Mt. Joy, Pa. This feature will be the largest in Linn's painting experience and will be exhibited in Ed Hackett's show room (store facing exhibition grounds).

This photo is one of the exhibited paintings, recently painted, of "Chiquos Rolling Mill," located near what was well known to many as the "Posy Patch," now owned by the Mount Joy American Legion, and located along the old highway, one mile west of Sa-Junga. Although no more of this mill remains but a portion of the foundation, this painting was formulated with the aid of a mental picture in Linn's memory together with that of several neighbors and a small photo. Thus was brought back to life what has been an old land mark in this county for many years.

All the large paintings exhibited constitute last year's work except few paintings. The one is an oil of the apartment and home of Mrs. Anna V. Grisinger, painted in 1940 and which was Linn's first attempt at painting homes and farms. The other painting is of the Longenecker Homestead where he and his brothers and sisters were born and reared and which is being exhibited by public request.

Included in the exhibit are paintings of many farms located in many parts of Lancaster Co., also bridge scenes, portraits, animal sketches and velvet paintings.

During the evenings of Thursday and Friday and Saturday afternoon and evening Linn will be present and all other times he will have an attendant at the exhibit.

Religious Film Coming To Trinity Luth Church

"Salts of the Earth," the new religious motion picture produced in the Pennsylvania coal fields and in Hollywood for The United Lutheran Church in America, will have a premiere showing at Trinity Lutheran Church, Mount Joy at 7:00 o'clock on Oct. 24, it was announced today by the Rev. W. L. Koder, pastor.

"Salt of the Earth" is the dramatic story of what one man did when he took God seriously. Robert Armstrong plays the leading role of Harley Russell, a coal miner. He is supported by such feature players as Lane Chandler, Russell Hayden, Pierre Watkin, Kurt Katch, and the King's Men Quartet. Special music, based on the well-known hymn, "Jesus, My Lord, My God, My All," was written for the film. This motion picture was produced for The United Lutheran Church in America by Cathedral Films of Hollywood and was directed by John T. Coyle who directed the United Lutheran production, "And Now I See," which has been seen by more than 1,000,000 church members of all denominations in one year.

The theme of "Salt of the Earth" is stewardship and evangelism. With the coal mines and a coal mining town as the setting, the film drives home what the average man can do in his home church once he has decided he must serve his Lord. The climax is reached when this miner goes out to bring his enemy into the church.

This film was produced as part of the 30th anniversary program of the United Lutheran Church celebrated this year. It will be shown in all 4,000 congregations of this church body this fall.
