At the Safe Harbor dam 1,000 catfish, 300 sunfish and 1,000 tadpoles were stocked.

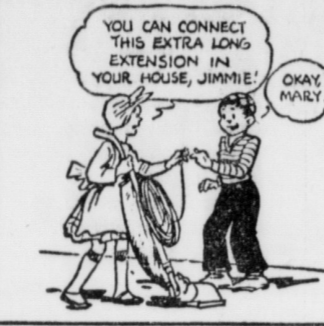
GET SOILS READY

Week's Best Recipe

Spaghetti Sauce: 2 small onions, chopped, 1/2 green pepper, chopped, 1 pt. mushrooms, sliced, 1 lb. ground beef or veal, 2 T chopped parsley, 1 c ground carrots, 2 cloves garlic, 2 t salt, 1 t pepper, 2 t celery seed, 2 t sugar, 1 No. 2 can tomatoes, strained, 1 c meat stock, 1 small can tomato paste, 1 t ground cloves, 1/2 t cinnamon. Saute onion, peppers, mushrooms in small amount of hot fat. Add beef, cook until seared. Add parsley, carrots, garlic, salt, pepper, celery seed, sugar, tomatoes, stock, tomato paste, cloves and cinnamon. Cook sauce slowly 1 hour, remove garlic. Continue cooking another hour, or until thick. Stir time to time during cooking. Pour sauce over cooked spaghetti. This sauce may be prepared a day ahead, for long slow cooking.

Halloween Party

With a meat meal, have one of the vegetables an orange goblin. Hollow out the orange, make a goblin face with India Ink, fill orange cup with mashed sweet potatoes capped with a marshmallow, toasted under broiler. For sandwiches with a soft drink, cut rounds from sliced bread. With sharp scissors, cut eyes, nose and mouth from top round. Spread lower bread round with jelly of peanut butter and you have a goblin face sandwich. Make gingerbread cookies, frost with icing and when icing hardens, write first name of guest in semi-sweet chocolate squeezed through paper cone. Hollow out apples, fill with raisins, chopped apple, mayonnaise, for salad. Make a goblin face by cutting surface of apple peel then fill the eyes, nose and mouth, with cream cheese.

Hotse Vines

Most homemakers like vines for touches of green in the house. There are a variety that can be grown in water. Plant foods in tablet form, dropped in the water, about once every six weeks, the plant foliage wiped clean each week with a damp cloth, will make hardy growth. Here are a few vines grown in this manner: Periwinkle or Trailing Myrtle, better in rooms or sleeping porches that are not too well heated; Philodendron, best in warmer rooms with moist atmosphere; Wandering Jew, solves the problem of western exposure; English Ivy, usually better in soil but often thrives well in water but must be well rooted.
