Lancaster County Rats Should Start Worrying

A county wide campaign to war on rats, was organized Nov. 8. The following officers were elected, Chairman, Walter Geisler, Brownstown; Vice Chairman, Walter Shank, Lancaster, RD 6; Secretary and Treasurer, J. Lloyd Harnish, Lancaster, RD 6; D. C. Witmer and Curvin Martin of this borough, will assist in contacting folks in the area, and aid in distribution of poison bait.

Rats are a menace to any community from a health and sanitation standpoint. They also consume a lot of food and make unfit for either human or livestock consumption about twice as much as they consume. At certain times during the year rats migrate from place to place.

The average number of rats per farm in the county is about ten. The number varying from none to several hundred per farm. One rat will eat about one bushel of grain in a year and destroy several more.

Poison bait will be mixed at a central point Nov. 23. A safe poison (fatal only to rodents) will be used. This will be mixed fresh that morning and must be laid for the rats that evening. Five pounds will be enough for the average farm. Homes and other buildings will take from one to three pounds.

County Farmers and Borough Residents are urged by drive officials to take part in killing as many rats as possible to reduce property and food damages and health hazards.

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE INCORPORATION OF A BOROUGH AUTHORITY
Be it ordained by the Borough Council of the Borough of Mount Joy, Lancaster County, Pa., as follows:
Section 1. The Burgess and borough council, being the municipal authorities of said Borough, hereby signify their intention to organize an Authority under the provisions of the Municipality Authorities Act of 1945.
Section 2. The name of the Authority shall be Mt. Joy Borough Authority.
Section 3. The following persons constitute the first Board of the Authority, and they respectively shall serve for the terms set after their names: to wit: Harry G. Walters, one year; Simon P. Nissly, two years; William Batzel, three years; Grant Gerberich, four years; Samuel H. Miller, five years.
Section 4. The Burgess and the Borough Secretary are directed to execute, acknowledge and file with the Department of State, Articles of Incorporation to be prepared by the Borough Solicitor in accordance with this ordinance.
Section 5. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
