### ETOWN MAN ARRESTED HERE FINALLY PLEADS GUILTY

Changing his plea from not guilty to guilty after testimony for the Commonwealth had been presented, Luther J. Clarke, 54 E. Washington St., Elizabethtown, was fined \$200 and costs on the charge of operating a vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor.

Clarke was prosecuted by Michael Good, local policeman, on Sept. 30. Testifying Wednesday were Cpl. William B. Templeton, State Police, who first observed Clark and warned him not to drive his car; Dr. William M. Workman, who examined the man on the request of the police and pronounced him under the influence of an intoxicant; Officer Good, who told following the defendant and seeing him narrowly escape several accidents by driving in a zigzag manner, and Irvin Kaylor, constable of this town, who corroborated Good's testimony.
