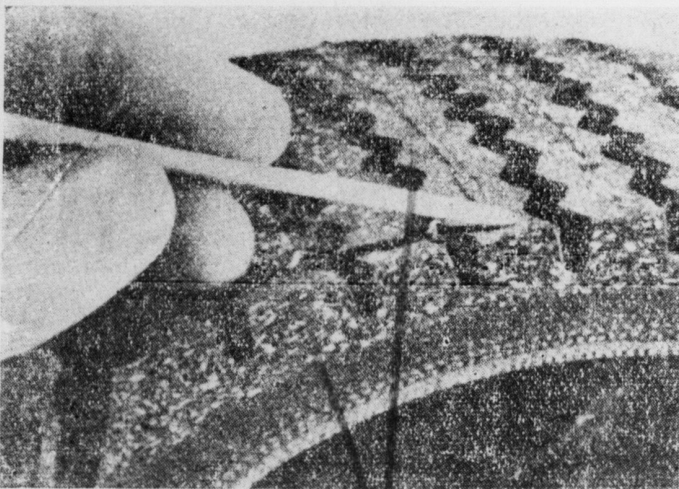


TAKE STEPS TO BUSINESS SUCCESS
