Final League Game Here Mon. Night

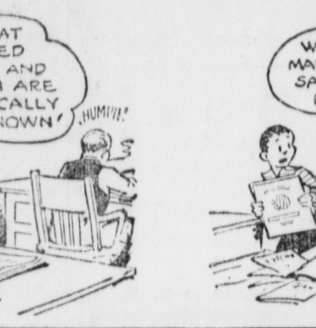
The Mt. Joy Legion team will play its last league game with New Holland on Monday, Feb. 14th on the High School floor. The first game begins at 7:00 p. m.
