### Pa. Farmers Hit By Falling Prices

Farmer of Pennsylvania, hit by falling beef and hog prices, experienced greater price declines than farmers of the Nation during the first month of 1949 compared with the last month of 1948, the State Department of Agriculture has announced today.

The index of prices received by Pa. farmers for principal agricultural products declined eight points during the month ended January 15th, a Federal-State survey disclosed. At the time there was no change in the index of prices farmers must pay for goods and for services such as labor, machinery interest and taxes.

Small grains, except barley, advanced from one to six cents a bushel. Corn at \$1.40 was up two cents a bushel, but \$1.09 less than a year earlier. Potatoes advanced 10 cents to average \$1.70 a bushel. Soybeans were down 25 cents to \$2.35 and apples declined 25 cents to \$2.70 a bushel.

Hogs and beef cattle were off a \$1.00 per hundred pounds live weight, but veal calves, sheep and lambs were up from 10-to-50 cents. Milk at wholesale was down 20 cents to \$5.60 a hundred pounds while retail milk declined from 21 to 21.2 cents a quart. Butterfat was down one cent to 66 cents a pound.

Eggs declined almost six cents to average 57.7 cents a dozen. Chickens, butter and wool showed no change from Dec. 15 prices.
