### MORE FARM OWNERSHIP

A statistic from 1948 is encouraging to those interested in farm ownership. About 72 percent, or more than seven out of ten farms of this country, were operated by full or part owners, last year. Those who operate land that they rent, in addition to their own, are classed as part owners. This percentage is the highest since such statistics were first compiled in the year 1900. Back in 1935, 42 percent of all farms were tenant-operated. This was the peak. For those who farm their own ground, the more farms so owned, the better. After all, it is natural that when a man is working for his own interest, the better off he is, also the country. As a nearby farmer puts it, "increase of farm ownership is a healthy sign in the rural America."

### THE SPRINGMORN MEDAL

The National Assoc. for the Advancement of Colored People, award each year, the Springmorn Medal to the American Negro judged to have made the highest achievement in any field of endeavor. When the mediator of the United Nations to Palestine was assassinated last year in Jerusalem, Dr. Ralph Bunche became acting mediator. Through his fair dealing and firmness of purpose, Dr. Bunche has brought about a more hopeful outlook between the Arab and Israel.

Dr. Bunche was born in Detroit and was taken as a child to Los Angeles. Lister an honor student and star athlete at the University of California, he brought further distinction to his race by becoming a member of the State Department and was associated with the United Nations when it was first formed.

Dr. Bunche is an outstanding American Negro. The honor of the Springmorn is great but the important point is the reason for which it was given him. Working for peace, a position of importance in the international picture, is an example that should bring hope or encouragement to his people.

### EASTER 1949

The good and bad in humanity belongs to yesterday, today and tomorrow. We live in memories, of yesterday, try to live in reason today, live in hope for tomorrow. As humans we carry the memories, the reasonings, the hopes, through our lives. What we do think, what we do, are essential elements of these lives. Yet in the passing from yesterday into today and tomorrow, no man can rise above the destructive forces which enter into these periods of time, without inspiration from a true faith, without the conviction that the good in humanity lives on. Otherwise, why would man aspire to triumph all over evil, if goodness and loveliness did not pass down through the ages? The unbeliever would ask if the cause was worth the fighting. This is the attitude of the doubting Thomas.

In the four Gospels of the New Testament, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, gave on account so deeply moving in its tenderness and its pathos, the story brings a poignant pain to believer and unbeliever alike. The Resurrection and the grief of Mary Magdalene, the tragedy and solemnity, unfold to bring forth light and immortality to the world. Sustained, and strengthened, maintained by this subjection of the Master, brings a realization that life of yesterday, today and tomorrow do not pass with death, that goodness of one so loved lives forevermore.

As we gather together in our local churches on this Easter Sunday, let us prepare to receive the truth proclaimed by the risen Lord, that whatever is man's faith, if he does life unselfishly, in reverence and with love, spreading gentleness and cheer, that the good of his yesterdays, today and tomorrow live after him. That is his re-birth and resurrection from death.
