## Annual Parish Meeting At St. Luke's Church

The Annual Parish meeting of St. Luke's Episcopal Church was held in the Church basement last Monday evening. The Brotherhood of St. Andrew served a buffet supper to the members present.

Those present were pleasantly surprised to find that the exterior masonry had been pointed and great areas of the interior walls of the basement rooms had been replastered, damp-proofed and had been paneled and many new electrical outlets and re-wiring was done. This work will make possible a most cheerful and attractive social center for the parish and educational equipment. A striking color scheme consisting of egg shell ceiling, yellow walls, gray-green trim and tile red furnishings make for a delightful over all effect.

The reports of the organizations and the Church Treasurer were received with appreciation as advancement was shown in every phase of the work. The Rector's report included a diagrammed picture explanation of the working of the parish, diocese and national Church. He also outlined some of his plans for the future of the St. Luke's and expressed satisfaction with the advance being made in property improvement, missionary work and the Church School and Choir, together with the devotional level of public services.

The election of the Vestrymen for one year resulted in the following men being chosen to serve with the Rector as the corporate body of the parish: Messrs Stanley Young, Elmer Brown, and Thomas Brown, Earl Shelley, Paul Stehman, Clair Sharpe, Willard Newton, Howard Brown, John Hipple. Mr. George Zeller was elected as honorary life member of the Vestry.

The Rector announced that Messrs Paul Stehman and Thomas Brown were to represent the Church at the Diocesan Convention on May 24 and 25 at St. Stephen's Cathedral, Harrisburg with Walter Schroll and Harold Brown as alternates.

This Sunday at 10:45 a. m. a service of dedication for the newly elected Vestrymen will be conducted by the rector. This service will be of special interest to all members of the Parish and all others who may be interested in the Anglican Church.
