Daniel Moore

Daniel M. Moore, one of the best known residents in the community, died at his home Friday night, at Newtown, Rapho Twp., after a two weeks illness of a cerebral hemorrhage. He was aged seventy-one years.

He was a miller by occupation and was employed at the Keeley Stone Works at Columbia for many years, doing his work the hard way. With several others, he had walked to and from Columbia daily, a distance of six miles in addition to putting up a "big floor" of moulds. This trip was made in all kinds of weather through the years.

Mr. Moore was a member of the Friendship Fire Co. of this place; the Mt. Joy Sportsmen's Assoc. and a former member of Cove Lodge No. 301, Knights of Pythias, which disbanded some years ago.

He held a beautiful emblem for twenty-five years of service at the Keeley Stone Works, Columbia.

He was quite a small game hunting enthusiast and one of the best shots in this section. In 1922, in a challenge match, at Harrisburg, he defeated the late Fred Dinger for the live bird championship of Pa. The editor served as referee at this match.

He resided at Newtown all his life and after retiring from moulding, has been farming several acres of tobacco annually.

He is survived by his wife, the former Kate Rhoads and these brothers and sisters: Harry and Dewey Hanafus and Mrs. Margie Rehm, all of this town.

The funeral was held in the U. B. Evangelical Church at Newtown on Tuesday afternoon with Bishop Christian Hostetter officiating. Interment was made in the Newtown Cemetery.

MOTORISTS ARE URGED TO PROTECT FORESTS

The State Planning Board, Department of Commerce, today urged travelers on State highways and through any part of 15,000,000 acres of forest to protect the State woodlands.

"The beauty of the forests and countryside," the Board said, "and the industries which depend upon the future growth of trees, are an important responsibility to all the highway travelers. Last year more than 12,000 acres of Pennsylvania forest land was destroyed by forest fires. Of the 842 fires, any one of which might have destroyed immensely more property than it did except for the efficient operation of the Forest Protection Service, the largest number were caused by transients along the highways and in the woods.

"Cigars or cigarettes thrown from car windows, unextinguished camp fires left by picnickers, hunters or fishermen are the chief enemies of Pennsylvania's forest industries and forest beauties."
