By a communication the Boro Authority reported that it had elected Paul A. Mueller as their legal council.

The various committees made their usual reports. Mr. Newcomer, of the Street committee, reported street oiling will begin the first week following July Fourth.

Mr. Keller, of the Water committee, reported reservoir cleaned and motor at pumping station repaired.

Supervisor Smeltzer reported that he needs better mowing equipment as his old mowers are "shot."

Pumping Engineer Schatz reported having pumped 145 hours by motor and 271 hours by turbine, a total of 9,296,000 gallons for the month of May.

Secretary Dillinger, of the Board of Health, reported one case of chicken-pox quarantined and one nuisance corrected.

Mrs. Nora Derr asked permission to erect a porch in front of her home on West Main street. Inasmuch as she has a pavement 14½ ft. wide and the boro ordinance stipulates an 8-ft. sidewalk, her request was complied with.

Roy Hoffman made his usual complaint relative to a street light, water and the conditions of the street at his home but Council turned a deaf ear.

Treasurer Karl Krall made his monthly report relative to the various accounts. There is a balance of \$1,499.26 in the Boro account and \$11,520.08 in the Water account.

Both our local banks, The First National Bank and Trust Company and the Union National Mount Joy Bank presented bids on interest rates for a \$15,000 loan for the purchase of a fire engine. The bids were very close but the First National being \$6.50 lower, was granted the loan, a resolution authorizing same being passed. The sealed bids were opened at the meeting by Secretary Brian.

Solicitor Arnold was present and explained in detail the method of procedure in transferring the Water Works, "pack, bag and saddle," to the Boro Authority. Both Council and the Authority should meet, discuss the subject and mutually agree on the matter, then the necessary documents will be drawn up and the transfer legally made.

A number of property owners on West Donegal street appeared before Council with a request relative to the street bordering their homes. The Solicitor will prepare a petition which, in due time, will be given further consideration by Council.
