The game was a pitcher's battle between Don Eshleman and Bob Herr, down to the last out. Eshleman was in trouble in the second inning when Ed Appel led off with a triple, but he retired the next three batters with no damage. In the top of the fifth Boyd doubled and Newschwager walked to put men on first and second with no outs, and then after a 20 minute intermission, due to the sun blinding the batter and catcher, Eshleman again got the next three batters, to get out of trouble. However with two outs and men on first and second in the top half of the sixth, Boyd had singled sharply over second to score with the games only run.

Mount Joy had scoring opportunities in the third when Elwood Rice singled, was sacrificed to the second by John Miller, and went to the plate on a wild pitch, but was left stranded when McCue flied out. Then Risser stole second and Eshleman walked and they both advanced on a passed ball, to get in scoring position. However Gerald Wilson struck out, Ben Brown was awarded first base on catcher's interference and Raymond Harple went down swinging to end the game, which had to be called due to darkness.

Mt. Joy has two more games to play with Quarryville this season and both are at Quarryville, on June 28 and July 15. These two teams should both be in the thick of the fight for championship, along with Millersville and E-town, in County Section "A".

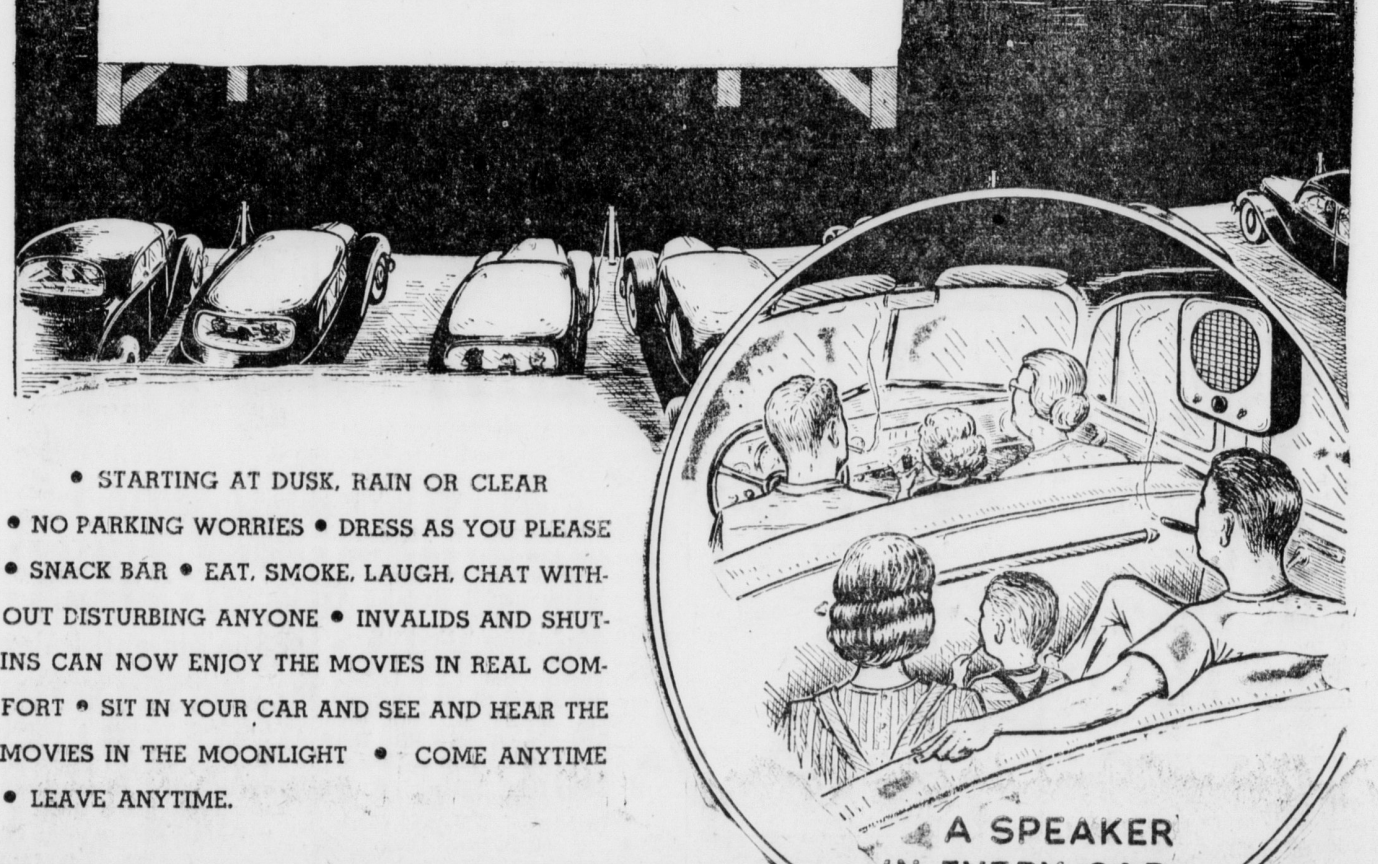
