(From Page 1) cations of the liquor laws of this State, but this court has reached the conclusion that where the quota of licenses in any municipality is filled, no retail licenses, including a club license, may be issued by the Pa. Liquor Control Board.

The opinion admits that "the appellant is a bona fide incorporated club and that it meets all the requirements of the Pa. Liquor Control Act except as to quota."

The appellant raised the question "Should the Liquor Control Board refuse a license when the quota is filled or when the quota is exceeded?" They also contended that a recent census or survey has shown that the present population of Mt. Joy Twp. to be 3,150 or an amount in excess of 3,000.

The court opinion stated it was guided by the 1940 U. S. decennial census which gives the population of Mt. Joy Twp. as 2,729 persons and Judge Schaeffer pointed out that the number of retail liquor licenses in effect in the township is three, being restaurant liquor licenses.
