SAVE FEED-CULL NOW
 Every Hen Out of Production Costs About 25c a Month to Feed

This is the time of the year when poor hens in the flock quit laying. They are molting or soon will go into a molt and won't lay again until late fall—when they'll probably be sold anyway to make room for the pullets.



But these early quitters will go right on eating feed, taking up space in the laying house and causing extra work. It has been determined that culls consume about 25c in feed each month. In a normal flock of 100 hens, about 30 have stopped producing by this time. So their owners will spend around \$7.50 a month—\$15 to \$22 in the next three or four months—to feed the loafers among each 100 hens.

You can save this money by culling out the birds that are not producing. It doesn't take long to pick them out and you can sell them for cash. The rest of the flock has a
