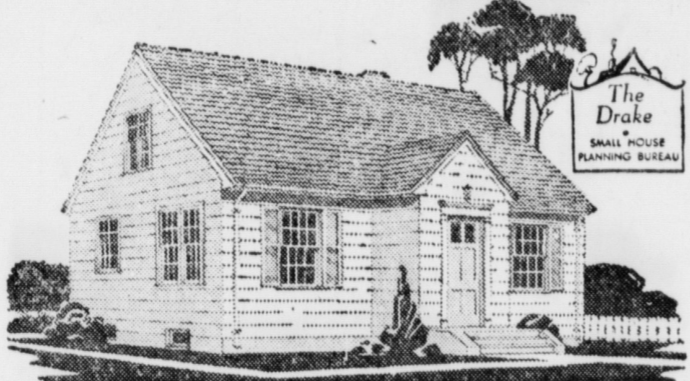

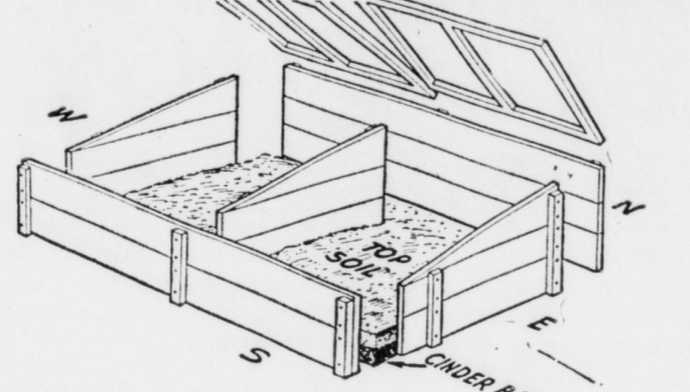

The Drake is a compact house with an arrangement of rooms and closet space usually found only in plans of much greater area. All of the rooms in The Drake have cross-ventilation and open to a central hall. This plan gives additional privacy to each room. The Drake's bedrooms have a generous amount of clothes hanging space in their wardrobes. There is a coat closet at the front entry and another located at the rear entrance. There is a storage closet and a linen cabinet in the hall. In all, The Drake is equipped with six first floor closets. The Drake's expansion-type attic can be finished in the future to provide either two bedrooms as shown on the plan, or a large dormitory type room for play and sleeping.

The exterior walls and ceiling of The Drake are insulated. Construction is of frame with siding on the exterior walls. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Overall size of The Drake is 22 feet by 26 feet. There is a full basement. The area of The Drake is 922 square feet and the house has a volume of 20,788 cubic feet.



Start Perennials Now Easy to Make SEED FRAME
Anyone handy with a hammer and saw can construct this sturdy seed frame. It is made up of four sides, and a hinged top glazed with Vimlite, flexible plastic glazing. Vimlite is used because it is shatterproof, lightweight, has good insulation qualities and is easy to install. No grooving of the frame, or putting in necessary. Vimlite is merely tacked in place like fly screen.

The standard size for seed frames is 3 feet x 6 feet. To protect it against rot and decay, the lumber used should be treated with Dow's pentachlorophenol. This chemical and Vimlite can be obtained at hardware, lumber and building supply stores.

Assemble the four sides, center partition, and top frames according to the sketch. For permanent construction it is advisable to use galvanized screws instead of nails.

The seed frame is set in place on the ground with the high side to the north, and the top sash slanted toward the sun. The inside should be filled with 3 inches of cinders or gravel and then a layer of top soil. This insulates against cold, and improves drainage. When the seed frame has served its purpose each season, it should be moved and stored until it is time to use it again.

FOUR POTATO CROP FORECAST FOR STATE
While July rains brought improvement to the 1949 Pa. late potato crop, prospects for the smallest harvest in 51 years still held, according to Federal and State surveys announced by the State Department of Agriculture.

As of August 1st the production estimate was for a crop of 15,450,000 bushels, about 4,099,000 less than last year. This estimate compares with 19,425,000 harvested in 1948 and the 10-year average (1938-47) of 19,275,000 bushels.

An almost rainless June, plus ten weeks of abnormally high temperatures which continued on through July and into August, brought grief to Pa. potato men. Rains of July greatly improved the situation, except in the northeastern quarter of the state and on the Potter County plateau area, celebrated for the production of certified seed potatoes.

72,866 ON RELIEF
Pennsylvania's General Assistance rolls continued to rise during the first week in August. The net increase in that week amounted to 1,705 persons and raised the total number of persons receiving this type of aid to 72,866.

Insect Killers Made By Synthetic Means
New pyrethrum-like chemicals that kill insects have been made synthetically for the first time in the laboratories of the bureau of entomology and plant quarantine. It has been announced by the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

The chemical makeup of the synthetic materials is almost identical with that of the insect-killing principle in pyrethrum, according to the chemists.
