Farm Topics

Ringold Lady Dora Is Champion Again

Raises Litter of 10 To 447 Pounds Weaned
Ninety-six pigs raised to weaning age is the remarkable new record of America's champion production sow. She is Ringold Lady Dora, a purebred Hampshire owned by Meadowlark Farms, Inc. of Sullivan, Indiana, and the only sow of any breed to qualify for an 8th star in production registry books.

The champion calked up her new record this spring when she raised a litter of 10 pigs, nine of them eligible for registration, to weigh 447 pounds at weaning time, 56 days.

To qualify for production registry, conducted by the purebred associations, a sow must raise a litter of at least eight pigs to a minimum weight of 320 pounds within 56 days. They must be approved breed type, free from fault.

Home Sewing
Home sewing definitely is far from a seasonal activity now, if official pattern sales can be a criterion. Pattern companies report a fairly balanced distribution throughout the year. During 1948 the records show that January was the weakest month, but still only five percent away from the volumes of the top months. The top months were no more than three per cent more than other months with the exception of January.

Garlic Bread
To make garlic bread for serving with special salads or casseroles, cut a loaf of French or Vienna bread into thick slices, but do not cut entirely through into the bottom crust. Mash a clove of garlic into three or four tablespoons of margarine. Spread this between the slices of bread and pop the loaf into the oven until hot and crisp.

Radio Waves

LEAVES FLOWERS, SHRUBS
When gathering leaves for compost, be sure to burn those of elm or any tree that has become diseased. If you are planting shrubs, have holes large enough to make room for root spread. Pack good soil between roots, then over them, tramp down and water well. Mulch over the root spread. Shrubs planted this fall usually flower the first season. Except for bulbs, soil around the smallest perennial to the largest tree, planted in the fall, should have water poured into the hole before roots are covered. From this planting until freezing weather the plants should be soaked thoroughly once a week.

SOUNDS GOOD
Stuff frankfurters for a fall meal. Though they are good stuffed with cheese and wrapped in bacon, vary this by changing the stuffing to: sauerkraut, smoky cheese or swiss with chopped green pepper, or mashed potatoes and chopped onion or pickle relish, sliced dill pickles and grated pineapple, chopped ripe olives.

Cut a slit not quite through a frank and place stuffing in slit. Broil or bake until stuffing is cooked and frankfurter heated on through.
