

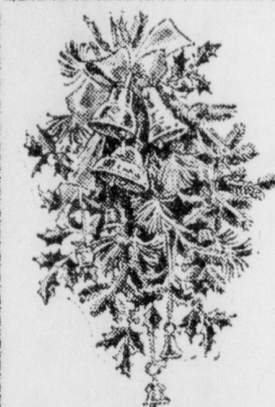

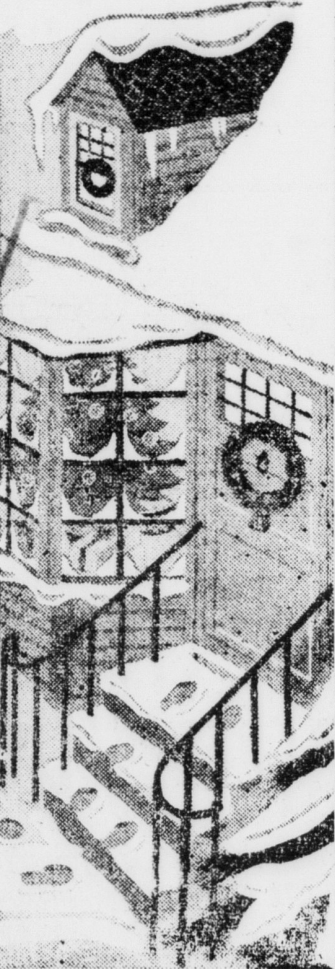

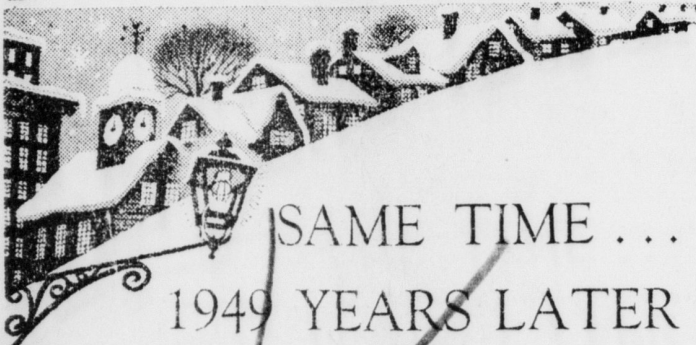

round Philadelphia and collect samples from producers, dealers and distributors.

Shupp takes the samples to the laboratory of the Inter-State Milk Producers Co-operative at 401 N Broad St., Philadelphia where he makes two of the tests himself. Using an instrument called a lactometer to measure the specific gravity of milk, he checks whether any water has been added. Milk is 87 per cent water in its normal state, Shupp pointed out and it is almost impossible to tell by inspection whether it has been watered. Sometimes watered milk has a bluish tinge after the cream has risen to the top. It with homogenized milk in which the butterfat does not rise to the top.

Next Shupp tests for butterfat content. The samples are put into a centrifuge. The whirling action forces the butterfat into the long thin necks of the sample bottles where it is easily measured. The broad purpose of the commission, he said, is to insure a pure and adequate supply of milk at a fair price.

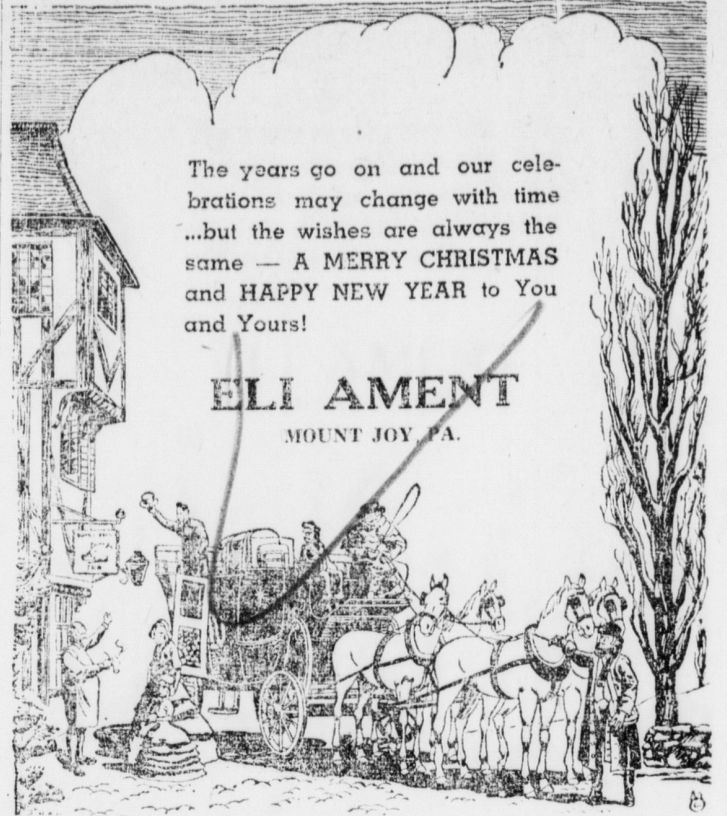

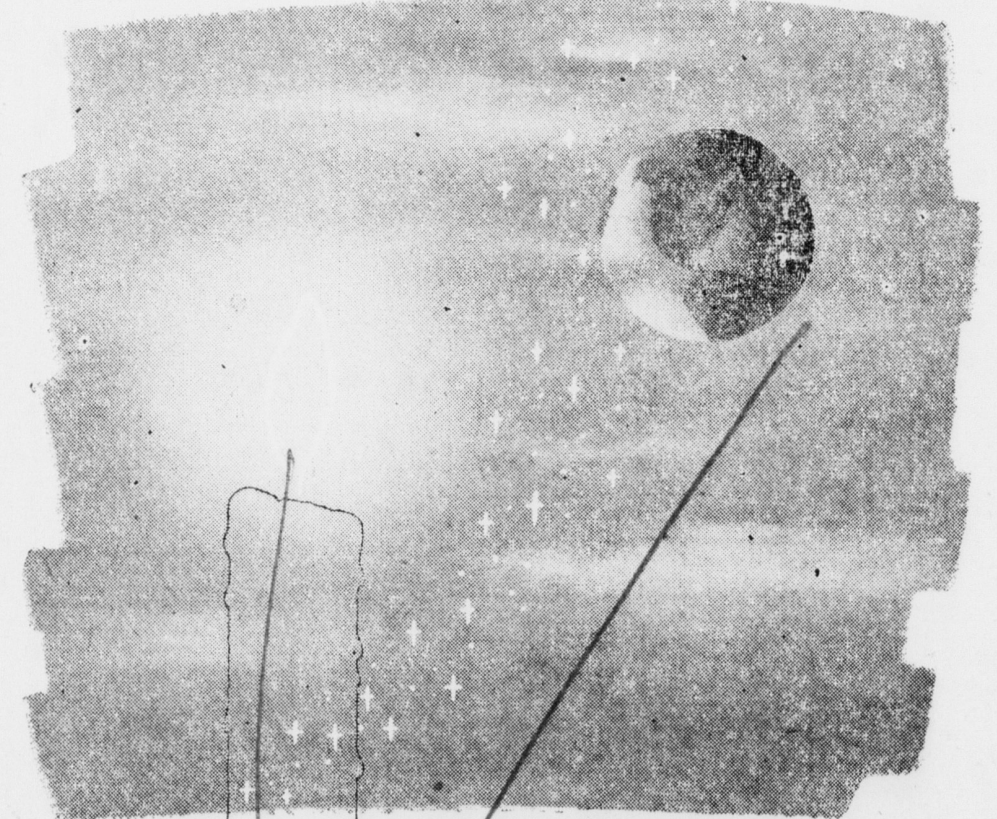
