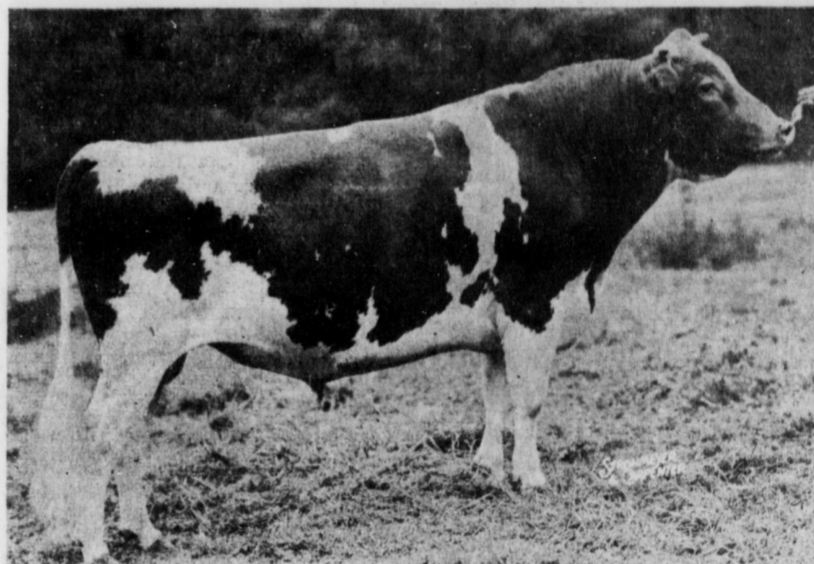
Our Fire Laddies Installed Officers Thursday Evng.
