ment.
When a plea of guilty is entered in a murder case, the judges sit without a jury to hear the testimony, and decide the degree of crime as well as the sentence of the defendant.

Eichelberger, 73 year old repair-
man, was found dead in the small
home in Florin where he lived
alone, on the night of Jan. 29th.
Cause of death was a bullet wound
discovered the next day as the
body was being embalmed.

Troutwine was apprehended the
day after the bullet was found and
held by State Police, who announ-
ced he had confessed the slaying.
"I shot him to scare him away
so he wouldn't keep me awake all
day," police quoted Troutwine as
saying at the time.

At 10:45 a. m. Monday, immedi-
ately after the Grand Jury had
returned a true bill against Trout-
wine, he was brought before the
Court by his attorneys, Charles
W. Eaby and Charles W. Eaby Jr.

As the clerk, Miss Marion Lutz,
was about to ask Troutwine how
he pleaded, the elder Eaby inter-
rupted.

"After having gone through the
facts in this case, we have come to
the conclusion that the proper
procedure under the circumstances
would be to enter a plea of guilty
and ask the Court to fix the de-
gree of murder and punishment."

five feet deep and the temperature
is often 50 below zero. Fortu-
nately, there is no wind.

They live in a girls' dormitory,
but have no trouble getting along
as they are used to a large family.
They have five sisters and three
brothers.
