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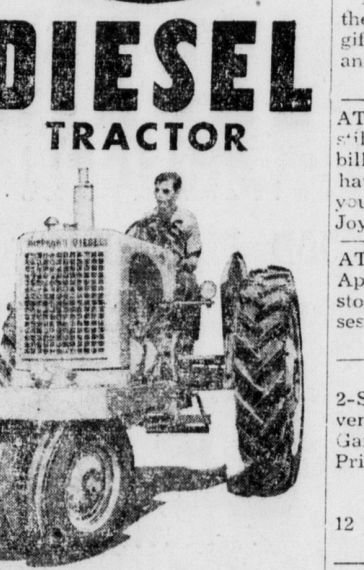

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING TERRITORY TO THE BOROUGH OF MOUNT JOY WHEREAS, a petition has been presented to the Borough Council of the Borough of Mount Joy, requesting the Borough to annex to itself and make a part of the Borough, certain land hereinafter described, situated in Mount Joy Township, Lancaster County, Pa., which is a second class township. And it is represented to said Council by the said petition that the signers of the said petition, 32 in number, constitute a majority of all of the freeholders of the land described in the said petition, and said Borough Council is satisfied that the said signers are a majority of all of the freeholders of the land therein described. Therefore, Section 1. The Borough of Mount Joy, Lancaster County, Pa., pursuant to the above recited petition, does hereby annex to the Borough, and make a part of the Borough, the following described land situated in Mount Joy Township, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, adjoining the Borough, which lands are bounded and described as follows, as appears by survey and blueprint made by Henry F. Huth, Registered Engineer, filed with said petition, to-wit: BEGINNING at a cement monument on the North side of the Harrisburg Pike and the West side of Orchard Street, a corner of land of O. K. Snyder, Jr.; thence extending along the West side of Orchard Street and land of O. K. Snyder, Jr. and Kathryn Snyder, respectively, North nine (9) degrees and seventeen (17) minutes East, a distance of seven hundred and fifty-six and thirty-five hundredths (756.35) feet to a cement monument in line of land of Charles S. Frank; thence extending along land of the said Charles S. Section 3. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed. This annexation shall become effective at the time and in the manner prescribed by law.
