M. on April 3, 1950 at the Borough Hall, Mount Joy, Lancaster County, Pa., the Council of the Borough of Mount Joy will hold a public hearing on, and immediately thereafter, is to consider the adoption of certain proposed amendments to the Zoning Ordinance of the Borough, which amendments have heretofore been submitted to the Borough Planning Commission as required by law. The amendments to be considered propose the following:

1. To change from classification of Residence "A" district to Residence "B" district, the following areas: (a) Along the East side of North Market Street from an alley north of Frank Street to the Borough limits; (b) along the Western side of North Barbara Street, from Frank Street to the Borough limits; (c) along the Eastern side of North Barbara Street from North Alley to the Borough limits; (d) the area South of Oak Alley, East of Pinkerton Road, and North of South Alley.
2. To change from Residence "B" district to Business District, an area bounded on the North by Pennsylvania Railroad Company property, on the East by South High Street, on the South by East Donegal Street, Oak Alley, Delta Street and West Donegal Street, and on the West by South Market Street.

Coffee Stimulates Trade
Coffee, whether or not it serves to enliven or stimulate the drinker, is certainly a stimulant to international trade. In 1947 it stood number one in the list of commodities imported into the United States— as it has in many of the years since 1900. Always it has been an outstanding import item, though occasionally surpassed by sugar, hides and skins, rubber, wool and mohair, or silk.

Kerosene Ranges
It is very dangerous to use gasoline in a kerosene range. Kerosene ranges are designed and built to use only one fuel, namely kerosene. Gasoline is much more flammable than kerosene, so using it in a stove designed for kerosene is to take a very considerable risk. Even when using kerosene, great caution should be observed.
