Week's Best Recipe:

**Apple-Raisin Rolls:** Biscuit dough 2 c chopped tart apples, 1/2 c seedless raisins, 1 t cinnamon, 1 c sugar 1-4 t nutmeg, 1 c water, 1 T butter, 1-4 c all-bran. Roll biscuit dough one-quarter inch thick, spread apples and raisins. Sprinkle with cinnamon. Roll up and slice like cinnamon rolls, 1-inch wide, place out side down in greased baking pan. Combine remaining ingredients; heat to boil, cool slightly and pour over rolls. Bake in moderately hot oven, 40-50 minutes. Serve with cream.

### Gift Hints:

Remember just before Christmas you said you were going to make your gifts for next year, early? Why not bring now and avoid the rush? There are attractive needlepoint glass cases with needlepoint coin purses and wallets to match. Beautiful applique of a floral design on a plain color of moire, velvet, crepe makes a knitting bag for "dress up". Fine cross-stitch embroidery on pillow cases and across the top hem of a sheet would delight any woman. There are so many attractive gifts to be crocheted from metallic yarns and cords: slippers, bags, hats, purses, evening sweaters.

### Have You Tried?
