Maytown Elementary Schools. Parents are urged to register such beginners now at either grade school or at the office of the Supervising Principal, Dr. J. W. Bingeman, at Maytown. The school telephone number is Marietta 6-3024. To enter East Donegal Schools in September 1950, students must be six years of age on or before January 31, 1951. No student will be enrolled in September 1950 until the preschool examinations are taken.

At the regular monthly meeting of the East Donegal School Board held last Tuesday evening, a tentative budget \$145,116 was proposed for the 1950-51 school term. The budget is to be adopted at the May meeting of the board when the tax rate is also to be set. It was announced that there will be no school Friday, April 21, allowing teachers to attend Schoolmen's Week at the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia. General school supplies and art supplies contracts were awarded to L. B. Herr & Son, Lancaster, for a total of \$1,375. A proposed school calendar for 1950-51 was adopted. East Donegal Schools will reopen Wednesday, September 6. Faculty meetings will be held Tuesday, September 5. Schools are scheduled to close June 3, 1951.

Representing East Donegal High School at the Southern District Student Council Convention at Carlisle High School on Friday, April 14th were: Wilbur Brubaker, Rose Musser, Jane Waller, Pauline Bradley and Joe Brandt. They participated in a Panel Discussion in the afternoon, followed by a tour through the Carlisle barracks, and they were honored at a banquet in the evening.
