### Buddy Poppy Day Honors War Dead

While a small portion of the proceeds from the sale of V.F.W. Buddy Poppies is distributed nationally to further the service work of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the bulk of the money collected in Mt. Joy will remain here to help carry on the welfare activities in this community, Commander Martin Brown, of V.F.W. Post 5752, explained today.

"When the 29th annual V. F. W. Buddy Poppy Sale is conducted every citizen should realize that when he makes his contribution, he is not only bringing much needed assistance to our own needy veterans, but is also helping those disabled veterans who are confined to hospitals throughout the country," Commander Brown said.

This year, the V.F.W. hopes to sell 20 million Buddy Poppies. Funds will be used to assist disabled and needy veterans, war orphans and the widows of veterans. Also, proceeds will be used to implement the V. F. W.'s extensive rehabilitation program for war veterans and their dependents.

"It doesn't matter whence a veteran is from," declared the Commander, "we are always ready to help him, and doesn't have to be a V. F. W. member."

"We hope the citizens of Mount Joy will be as generous on Buddy Poppy days as in the past." May 26, 27, 29, & 30 has been designated as Poppy Days in Mount Joy, Commander Brown stated.
