

Everything That Happened At Florin Recently

On Saturday, July 22nd, 7:45 p. m., a full-length sound film entitled, "Reaching for Heaven", will be shown. It is skillfully written, beautifully acted and presents a heart-warming picture of personal evangelism in action. It emphasizes the unforgettable message that God uses ordinary people to accomplish His purposes in the lives of others.

On Sunday, July 23rd, the Rev. Dr. Albert M. On Sunday, July 30th, the morning worship service will be held at 11:00 o'clock, with the Rev. Dr. W. Galloway Tyson, Superintendent of the South District of the Philadelphia Conference speaking. The East Petersburg Male Acappella Chorus, under the direction of Willis S. Nolt, will sing. Bishop Fred Pierce Corson, Resident Bishop of the Philadelphia Area, will be the speaker. The closing sermon of the Camp Meeting will be preached by Bishop Corson at the evening service at 7:45 o'clock. The music will be provided by the choir of the First Methodist Church of Lancaster. The usual closing ceremony of the Camp Meeting will be conducted by Dr. Ketels.

A Vacation Bible School is held daily on the Camp Ground from 9:30 to 11:30 a. m., beginning Saturday morning, July 22nd. It is under the direction of Miss Kathleen B. Stetler, assisted by Miss Mary Jane Zimmerman.

There is no admission charge to the Camp Ground during Camp Meeting and ample free parking space is available. The Camp Grove is open to both family and church groups and affords excellent opportunity for a day's outing.

Following the Camp Meeting, Community Vesper Services will be held in the tabernacle each Sunday evening during August, including the first Sunday evening in September, under the auspices of all the churches of Landisville and Salunga. The entire community is cordially invited to join in these services.

LOCAL SEAMAN TRAVELED 26,000 MILES, VISITED THIRTEEN FOREIGN PORTS

After an eight-months tour of duty in the Far East during which time he traveled 26,000 miles and visited thirteen foreign ports, John Buchenauer, seaman, USN, of 121 New Haven St., Mount Joy, recently returned to the United States aboard the heavy cruiser USS Toledo, which will operate in Southern California waters this summer.
