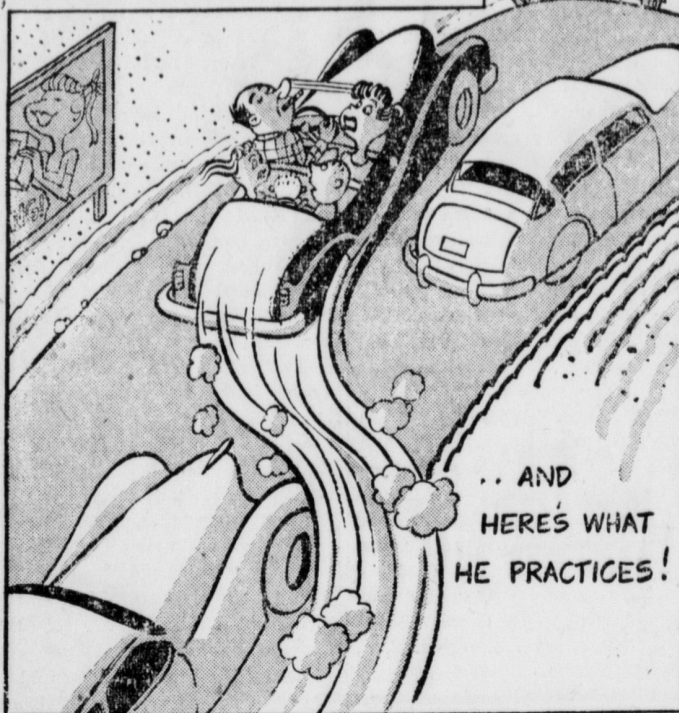
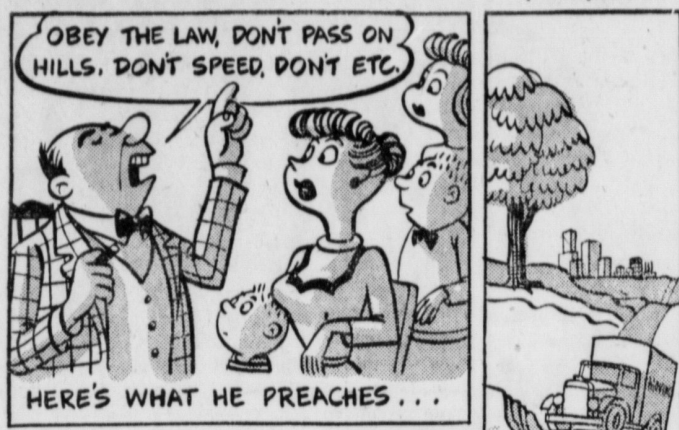

class in one room instead of various parts of the building. It would make possible special rooms—such as the music, the art, and the science room. Handicaps in the present domestic science and manual training classes could be overcome if they could be in the immediate building instead of downtown. Then, too, our classes are too large for the small amount of equipment we have. With more teachers and

classrooms, we could divide the classes into smaller groups. In this way, more individual attention could be given to the student by the teacher.

At the present time, our stage is being used as a music room. The adjoining classroom has much competition for when a music group is on the stage, a gym class often is in the auditorium. Our auditorium is also too small to accommodate school activities. With a larger stage and an auditorium used for their intended purposes, we would be able to have more school programs with more students participating at a time. A larger percentage of the students as well as parents and friends attending the program would receive the benefit.

A larger library with more books would not only aid in broadening the knowledge of us as students but would help us in preparing our lessons. At present, due to the use of the library as a classroom and because the librarian has teaching responsibilities, we have been unable to have it open at all times. If this could be overcome, the student could use the library whenever there was time available.

Although we have tried to keep our cafeteria clean and sanitary for eating purposes, its usage otherwise has made it almost impossible. Then, too, because of its smallness, it has been necessary to divide the school into separate lunch groups. This keeps us from being with our fellow schoolmates. If the whole school could have lunch together, our social life would be aided.

In conclusion, I would like to suggest that the more modern or attractive a student's surroundings in high school, the higher will be his aspirations and the easier his attainment for more successful living. Not only will he and his community be benefited, but so will the entire nation, which depends so strongly upon individual successes.

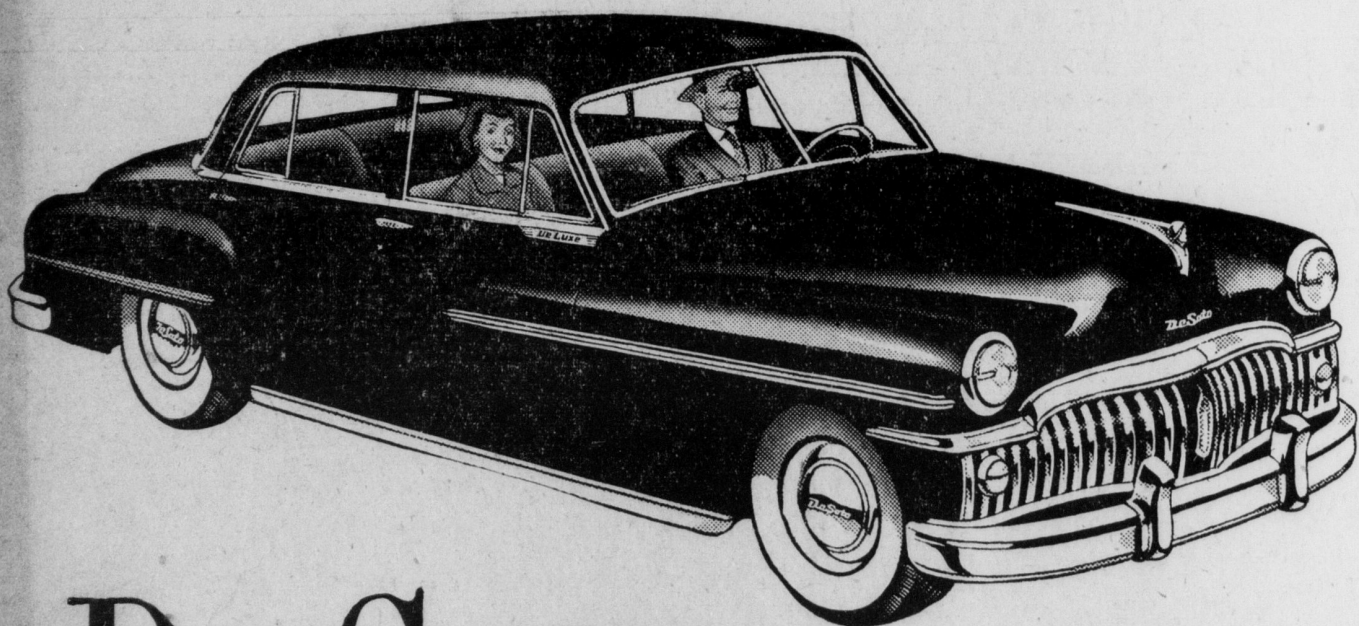
