

Fixing Up the Farm by BURTON WILLIAMS

**Exterminating Rats** 

WITH grain and food conserva-tion a pressing need today, one of the prime considerations of nearly every farmer should be extermination of rats. The annual damage to feed and flocks inflicted by rats amounts to millions of dol-lars. Not only do rats consume and spoil feed, but they kill chicks, spread diseases and damage buildings.

Number 1 on your program of rat extermination should be cleaning up trash piles and refuse of all kinds, especially in and near farm buildings. Then prepare for the kill by placing unpoisoned bait at locations frequented by rats. Repeat this operation for several nights to coay the rat population nights to coax the rat population out in force. Meat or fish is good bait, being a change of pace from the rats' usual grain diet. After lulling the rats into a false sense of security, place poison on the bait. About a week later repeat extermination, using different bait-



Don't overlook the importance of rat-proofing, however. The illus-tration above shows how grain can be stored on skids and blocks which leave plenty of room underneath for cats or dogs to catch prowling

Another effective control measure is to line the walls and floors of your farm buildings with asbestos cement board, a mineral product which is impervious to rats. This material, which additionally is weatherproof and fireproof, also comes in the forms of siding and

QUESTION: What causes it? ANSWER: A virus—too small to be seen even under a microscope. The amount you could get on the point of a pin could kill an entire herd of hogs.

QUESTION: Can you tell when a hog has cholera?

ANSWER: That's one of the worst things about hog cholera — a number of other maladies may show symptoms like it. Usually the first symptoms of Usually the first symptoms of cholera include loss of appetite, fever, weakness and prostration.
