### WHEAT 4 CENTS MORE THAN PRICE GUARANTEED IN '49

J. M. Denlinger, chairman of the Production and Marketing Administration, announced Tuesday that the Wheat in Lancaster County this year will be supported at \$2.19 per bushel.

The rate is four cents a bushel higher than the price guaranteed by the government in 1949. It is based on U. S. Number 1 wheat which is rare in this county.

Farmers who want to take out a loan on 1950 wheat are to deliver the crop to Nelson Weaver Mill, Lime Rock, Litzitz R2, or Stehman's Flour Mills, Mt. Joy, where the grain will be received and graded and a warehouse receipt issued to the grower.

### PREPARE CALVES FOR SHOW

Members of 4-H dairy clubs are urged by John Wheeler, extension dairy specialist of the Pennsylvania State College, to keep busy with the calves they plan to exhibit at district shows. He suggests keeping the calves blanketed, trimming their feet, and teaching the calves to lead by practicing every day.

### CONTROL MOSQUITOES

Clean up rubbish and weeds around the place to help control mosquitoes, urges Lloyd Adams, Penn State extension entomologist. They need water for breeding, so get rid of tin cans, bottles, old tires, and similar items in which water may stand.

### LADINO IS POPULAR

Ladino clover has become very popular with poultrymen as a pasture for their birds, reports H. H. Kauffman, extension poultry specialist of the Pennsylvania State College. It is an excellent feed and also helps to prevent infestation of internal parasites. The clover forms a mat which covers the soil.

### DAIRY BREEDING INCREASED

Artificial breeding is one of the fastest growing dairy programs, according to J. S. Taylor, Penn State extension dairy specialist. Ayrshire service has been added and Brown Swiss service soon will be available.

### ORDINANCE

#### RELOCATION, WIDENING, AND CHANGE OR GRADE AND OPENING NEW STREET

An Ordinance Approving and Establishing the Widths, Lines, Grades Drainage Structures, and All Other Structures Appearing on the Plan of the Department of Highways of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, showing Proposed Improvement on Main Street in the Borough of Mt. Joy Pennsylvania Adopting the Said Plan as the Official Borough Plan for said Street, and Approving and Opening as a Public Highway the Relocation of the Said State Highway Route and providing for the removal of structures.

WHEREAS, The Department of Highways has Submitted to the Borough Council of Mt. Joy Borough a plan showing the proposed improvement of a portion of State Highway Route No. 129-10 on Main Street, from Station 455+00 to Station 497+38.50 a distance of 118.50 feet, as shown by the said plan prepared and submitted by the Department of Highways, approved June 1, 1950, by the Ass. Chief Engineer of the Department of Highways.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Borough of Mt. Joy and it is hereby enacted and ordained i. v. authority of the same, that the widths, lines, grades, courses, distances, drainage structures, and all other structures shown on the plans prepared and submitted by the Department of Highways as aforesaid, be, and the same are adopted, and are hereby enacted and ordained as for the condemnation of an easement for highway purposes, the true and proper widths, lines, grades, courses, distances, drainage structures, of and for opening of the Borough of Mt. Joy Main Street, as shown on the said plan, which is hereby adopted as the official Borough Plan for the said Street.

SECTION 2. The President of the Borough Council and the Burgess are hereby authorized to execute the approval of the Borough to the relocation of the aforesaid State Highway Route, by affixing their signatures, and the Borough Seal, to the said relocation plan.

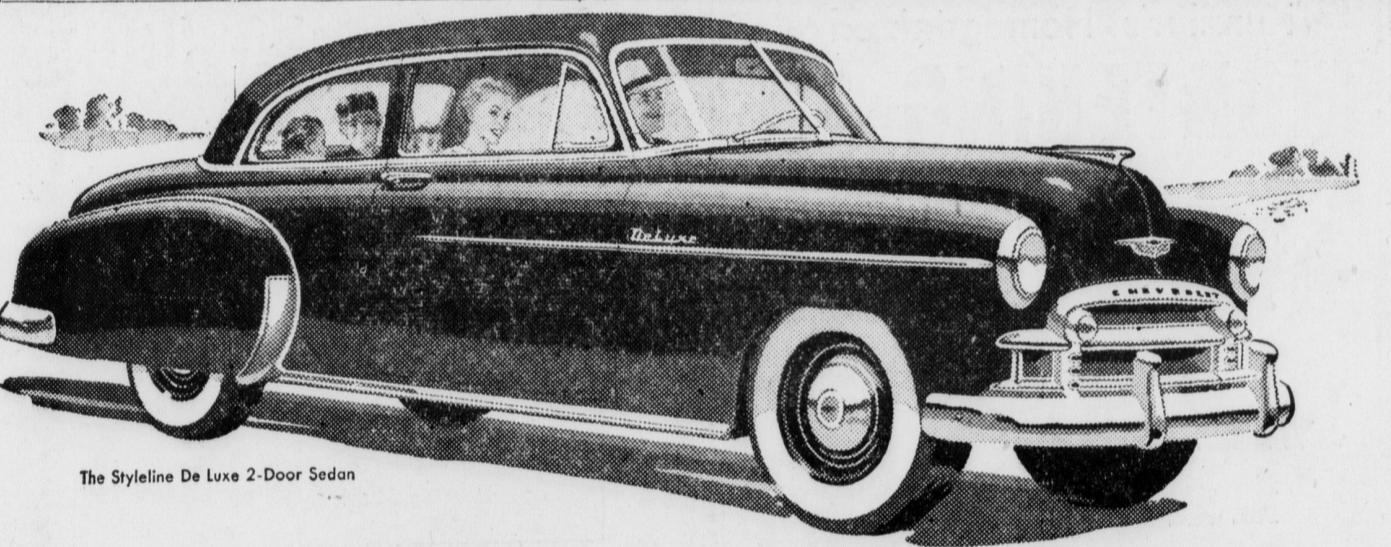
SECTION 3. Any portion of the said Street included in the aforesaid plan but not heretofore lawfully opened is hereby ordered and declared opened as a public highway with an easement for highway purposes condemned therefor and the Borough hereby assumes responsibility for the removal of all structures where necessary for the opening of the aforesaid plan.

SECTION 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its approval as provided by law.
