## THIS IS FARM SAFETY WEEK; DO TAKE WARNING

Under the theme "Learn and obey farm safety rules," State Secretary of Agriculture Miles Horst urged all rural residents to observe National Safety Week which began Sunday, July 23.

Immediate purpose of the week is to arouse interest and participation in the farm accident problem. The ultimate objective is to make farm life a safer, happier and more prosperous way of living. The movement has been endorsed by all leading farm organizations, he added.

Pennsylvania bears a large share of the losses in time and money caused by farm accidents. It is estimated that each year in the nation farm people sustain about 17,500 fatalities from accidents and probably more than 200 of these occur in our State. Out of a million and a half disabling injuries caused by accidents on farms of the country, possibly more than 10,000 happen on Pennsylvania farms and an alarming percentage of the 35,000 farm buildings destroyed by fire each year can be marked against Pennsylvania.

## GOOD TURKEY SUPPLY FOR HOLIDAY SEASON

The supply of turkeys from Pennsylvania farms for the holiday season should exceed the supply last year, according to Federal-State surveys announced by the State Department of Agriculture, and the number of poulters produced the first half of 1950 by Pennsylvania hatcheries exceeds the number the first half of 1949 by a goodly margin.

Turkey raisers indicated in January their intention to increase the number raised this year to 1,419,000 birds, or three per cent more than the 1,378,000 raised in 1949.

At the same time the Department reported chicken egg production for June at 265,000,000, a new record for the month, exceeding the previous high in 1948 by two million eggs. June production was down 17 per cent from May.
