Use one of those little nail brushes to scrub extra soiled places like neckbands, collars and cuffs. They do the job thoroughly and effortlessly leaving no skinned knuckles afterward.

Top your favorite fruit salad with this dressing: 1/2 cup sour cream in which 1/2 cup real mayonnaise and 2 teaspoons confectioners sugar have been mixed.

Whoops! There goes the feed tea right down your dress! But it's only cotton so you throw it in the washing machine and are you surprised. The hot water and soap have set the stain permanently. For tea, like vegetable juices, beer, coffee and highballs, contains tannin which is often barely visible when fresh, but shows up with heat and alkali. Rinse such stains in cold water first.

The commonest crime against fish is overcooking. The commonest complaint against fish is too dry and falling apart. Yet this, in nine out of ten kitchens, is caused by overcooking. So, let's take stock of our fish manners. Even one-half minute extra cooking can ruin fish.
