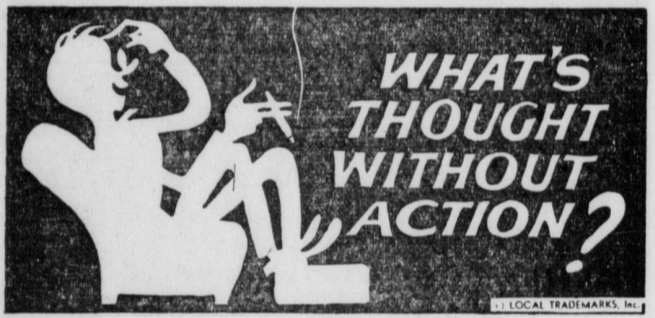

**TURNPIKE EXTENSION TOLL
SET AT \$1.20 PER AUTO**

The Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission today fixed a \$1.20 passenger car toll for the 101-mile trip over its eastern extension.

The run from the Harrisburg east shore interchange at Highspire to King of Prussia—80 miles—will be 90 cents.

Other rates to King of Prussia: From Downingtown interchange at Eagle, Chester County, 25 cents; Morgantown, 40 cents; Reading (Route 222), 50 cents; Lebanon-Lancaster (Route 72), 70 cents.

Truck and bus fares, which will be substantially higher, have not yet been announced.
