ATTEND R. Y. U. S. A. CONFERENCE

Dr. Robert F. Eshleman, Assistant Professor of Sociology and Economics, Elizabethtown College, participated as a member of a panel "A Long Time Program for Agriculture" at the national conference of the Rural Youth of the U. S. A. held at Jackson's Mill, West Virginia, October 12-15, 1950. Additional panel members included Carlisle DeLaCroix, Director, Youth Department, American Bureau of Agriculture, Chicago, Ill.; Paul Johnson, Editor, Prairie Farmer, Chicago; Mrs. Doris Wipert, Farm Homemaker, Washington Court House, Ohio and E. W. Afton, Field Agent, Extension Service, U. S. Department of Agriculture, Washington, D. C. The moderator of the panel was Dr. Arthur Bratton, of Cornell University Extension Economist.

Dr. Eshleman directed a 6-6 summary and discussion of the conference at the Saturday evening session which was followed by recreation and a candlelight service planned by the Illinois delegation. The 325 delegates represented 20 states and 6 foreign countries. The Rural Youth U. S. A. is an outgrowth of the American Country Life Commission appointed by President Theodore Roosevelt. Mrs. Eshleman accompanied Dr. Eshleman to the conference.

MAN AND WIFE FRESHMEN AT ELIZABETHTOWN COLLEGE

The Swedish wife of an American farmer and the daughter of a Chinese general staff officer in the Nationalist Army of Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek are among the new students at Elizabethtown College this year.

Blonde Anita Sophie Ingeborj Soderstrom Kenney, twenty, a native of Sweden, is a Freshman at Elizabethtown. So is her husband, farmer Mark Kenney, twenty-four, of Mt. Joy R1.

Their romance is the saga of a voyage through the Skagerrak and Kattegat during the Winter of 1947; of a cattleboat that got off its course and became ice-locked in the cold part of Karlskrona; of a three-mile trek across the frozen wastes of the Baltic Sea; of a Methodist revival service in Sweden, and of four 4,000-mile marriage proposals and three return rejection slips.
