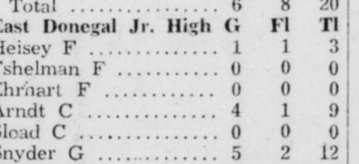
EAST DONEGAL DEFEATED MT. JOY JUNIOR HIGH
