### Valuable Real Estate and Personal Crushing and Chilling Cause of High Mortality Rate Among Pigs

Farm Electrification Bureau

Human beings have something to be thankful for, after all. Despite their various troubles, they still fare sauch better in this life than baby pigs. For studies record that the mor-belity rate among little porkers is one out of five during their first eight

weeks on earth.
What are the causes of this terrific foll? Sixty percent are traceable to crushing by the sow—the balance to chilling. The latter results from the imability of all little pigs, in a large litter, to get close enough to the sow to absorb necessary body heat. For some years now, the use of electric lumps and reflectors, to keep young stock warm, has gained in popularity in all sections of the country, where artificial heat is required at brooding artificial heat is required at brooding time. Not only is this method cleaner than heating the brooder house with coal or wood fires, but it eliminates considerable labor. With electricity, the farmer just flicks a switch and power takes over the brooding problem, giving pigs, chicks and lambs a healthier and faster start.

There are several simple, but highly effective and economical, brooding

There are several simple, but highly effective and economical, brooding devices available. The most popular are standard, or deep bowl reflectors equipped with cord and plug. These are hung in corners of the brooder house (figure 1), or may be used with hovers (figure 2). Hovers can be built of plywood or practically any type of of plywood or practically any type of surplus lumber around the farm. For the poultry raiser, who markets



POISONOUS PLANTS THREAT TO STOCK

Poisonous plants cause American livestock raisers many million dollars in death losses and sickness

If a livestock owner suspects that a pasture may contain poison ous forage, he can cut down his risk by allowing one of his least valuable animals to graze there.

10 days or two weeks, the pasture probably is safe. But as a double check, the owner should keep close watch on the animals. He should also keep antidotes on hand which he can give as first aid before the veterinarian arrives.
