ICE BOATING ON LAKE WALLEPAUCK

Pennsylvania Power and Light Company has announced that this year, as for the past several years, Lake Wallenpaupack will be available to the public for ice boating and sledding. Permits for the use of the Lake for these sports may be obtained from Mr. Robert Tragus, Lake Superintendent, whose office is at the Wallenpaupack Dam. No permits are needed for ice fishing which is also open to the public.

Attention is called to the fact that no persons are allowed on the Lake within 750 feet of the Dam or in the restricted area in that vicinity which is marked by No Entry notices. The company asks that all persons who use the facilities of the Lake observe this regulation carefully.

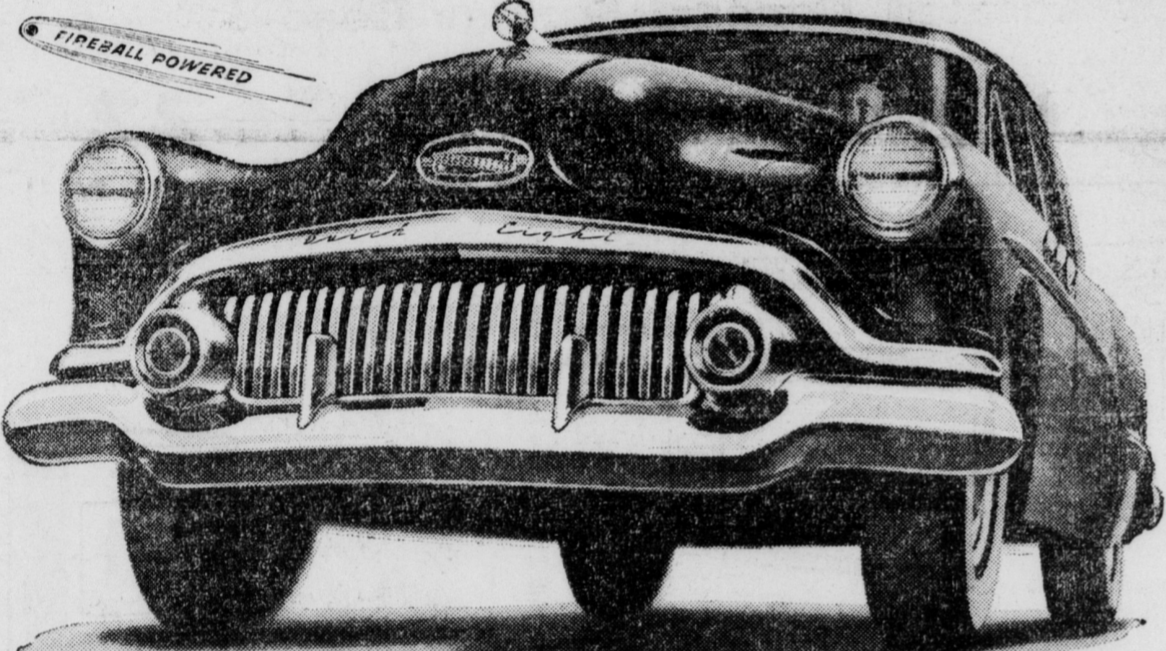
