Modernization of Homes Reduces Scald Fatalities Here's evidence that the good old days in some respects weren't so good after all. Forty years ago the loss of life through scalds or burns was seven times as high as it is today.

The improvement is due largely to the modernization of the American home with its improved heating, cooking, and lighting facilities.

The trend reflects in some measure the effect of consistent and widespread education for safety, and the marked advances which medical science has made in the treatment of severe burns.

Most important has been the passing of the old fashioned coal or wood stove, the kerosene lamp, and other hazards of past years.

Even now burns and scalds claim about 4,600 lives yearly in the United States, and many additional thousands suffer serious and disfiguring injuries which do not prove fatal.
