NATIONWIDE ALERT FOR 'X DISEASE'

Cattle raisers everywhere should on the alert this year for pos-sible outbreaks of "X disease," the strange new malady that affects cattle of all ages but seems to be especially common among animals under 2 years old. "X disease" already has caused cattle losses in more than 30

states. In some of the worst out-breaks, as many as 31 per cent of the animals in affected herds have stricken. Among diseased cattle, the death rate has been as

high as 59 per cent.

Just what causes "X disease," and how it is transmitted from one animal to another, no one yet knows. But extensive research in vestigations are being pointed up by the U. S. Bureau of Animal Industry and veterinary research leaders. In the meantime, veteri-narians are isolating identified cases immediately and developing echniques to combat the disease Symptoms usually include pro


