100 Yr. Old Books Were Presented to Dickinson College
 Daring our Centennial celebration, many, many points of interest were brought to light. Appended is another which concerns a lifelong resident, William Charles F. Reed, father of John Reed, of Steelton, and Charles E. Reed, of Philadelphia, the latter now occupying his homestead property one door west of The Bulletin office. William Charles F. Reed, above mentioned, was postmaster here from Sept. 1, 1877 to April 30, 1888.
 The following article is reprinted from the Sunday Patriot-News, Harrisburg, dated May 27, 1951:
 Carlisle—A complete set of text books used at Dickinson College 100 years ago has been presented to the school on the eve of its 78th commencement by the sons of the man who actually used them.
 The gift of John C. Reed, of Steelton, and Charles E. Reed, of Mount Joy, the remarkable collection contains the books of William Charles F. Reed, who was graduated from the college exactly a century ago.
 Immaculately preserved, the 60 textbooks were accompanied by Reed's exercise and composition books, the diploma he received on graduating in 1851, his membership card in Belles Lettres, the college's 165-year-old literary society, and other memorabilia of campus life then.
Displayed in Foyer.
 Comprising well over one hundred items, the collection, in perfect condition, has been placed on exhibit in the foyer of the college library for the commencement season running through June 3.
 Enclosed in four glass cases, the material illustrates the progress of a student through four years of college a century ago. And the highly unusual thing about the gift pointed out by Charles C. Sellers, the curator of Dickinsoniana, is its remarkable state of preservation.
 Reed, born in 1831, died in 1907. Distinguishing his collection of textbooks are Latin, Greek, German, education, political science, mathematics and English books—illustrative textbooks of a typical liberal arts course a century ago. All the books are leather bound.
 The composition and exercise books, comparable to a present-day student's notebooks, are in Reed's own handwriting, a clear, somewhat boyish scrawl.
 In a composition he wrote during his sophomore year, about Queen Victoria, he wound up with the sentence: "I pray that she is 29 years old and the mother of six children."
 His Greek exercise books list 62 exercises, at the end of which he has this notation: "The end. Huzzah!"
 For many students of today, the reaction is the same.
