### The Story of Our Independence Won 175 Yrs. Ago

One hundred and seventy-five years have now elapsed since the Representatives of the United States of America in General Congress assembled—in the name and by the authority of the good people of the United Colonies—solemnly published and declared that these United Colonies are and of right ought to be free and independent states; and that they are absolved from all allegiance to the British Crown and that all political connections between them and the State of Great Britain are and of right ought to be totally dissolved. They charge the "King of Britain with committing a long term of abuses and usurpations—evincing a design to reduce them

to absolute despotism," and condemn him in that he "dissolved representative houses".

They also declare that their "legislative powers are incapable of annihilation and, therefore, those powers have returned to the people at large for their existence".

This proclaims the Declaration of Independence. This is the essence of the causes which drove the American Colonies to destroy all British authority over them and to create a new nation—a republic—on this continent, responsible to no other nation or power except God.

How long were our Thirteen Original Colonies subjected to the abuses and usurpations from which they rebelled, broke their chains and cast their torturing tyrant a-sunder? The answer is "about 175 years—from Jamestown about 1602 to Independence 1776—a term as long as the entire life of our nation—1776 to 1951—to wit: 175 years".

The abuses and usurpations of "American Colonists" suffered during the one-hundred and seventy-five years consisted of two classes—first those against individual colonies; and later these brutalities which the United States was subjected to, when British domination and usurpations were inflicted upon the organized colonies as a whole people.

The abuses and tyrannical treatment which England inflicted on the individual Colonies arose out of the normal desire for free self-government—English legislation vs. American liberties. In Virginia the King of England compelled those colonists to submit to the Government of a council composed of seven men whom he appointed and a government operated almost entirely in England. The president of the council so appointed was a man named Winfield. In Massachusetts King Charles I. in 1629 granted the colony a charter in which the powers of the government were to be in the hands of the company of England; and later the charter was abolished by James II and Sir Edmund Andros, he appointed governor was a despot, and the American legislature was abolished—a terrible blow to liberty.

In Connecticut in 1638 a government was organized on religious principles and only church members were allowed to vote. In New Hampshire Edmund Andros—the English tyrant, was appointed governor over the colony and the colony lost its independence. In New York the English Duke of York would not allow the people to govern themselves by a legislature, but sent governors who were responsible only to him. The governor the tyrant, and they were compelled to obey other arbitrary tyrannical governors who oppressed the people. The spirit of independence was very strong in New York but the colony was often oppressed by tyrant governors appointed by the Duke of York. He was worse when he became King as James II. He refused to allow the people to have an Assembly and prohibited the printing press and ground down the people.

In the beginning, New Jersey suffered the same as New York because it was a part of that colony. In 1685 New Jersey became a separate colony. The people of New Jersey were always distinguished for their love of liberty and they made a manful stand against the attempts of royal governors to tyrannize over them.

Pennsylvania had a better fate than other colonies in its origin. The British Government owed William Penn's father, an admiral in the Navy who had died, a large sum of money. In 1681 the King gave and granted the soil of Pennsylvania to William Penn in payment. This made him the absolute owner and Great Britain could not interfere with William Penn's government and operation of it. William Penn died in 1718 and the Province passed to his sons and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania paid his sons \$580,000 for it.

Maryland was created in 1632 by a grant to Lord Baltimore from King Charles I. The grant was made to Baltimore, a good and religious man. The King's charter was very liberal and it provided that the people were not to pay any taxes to Great Britain. In 1691 King William made it a Royal Province and it so remained 25 years. In the year 1716 it's own self-government was restored and it re-

mained so till Independence.

For North and South Carolina King Charles II granted a charter in 1663 to certain proprietors in England. The English proprietors enforced serious impositions on the people. They revolted in 1667 and took possession of the government. The proprietors then sent Seth Sothel, an unprincipled man as governor and he plundered and oppressed the people for 6 years. At last the people banished him and took the government into their own hands. Then a great improvement followed.

We have now set forth and show the usurpations inflicted by the British King and his government upon our Original American Colonies individually. Finally, our brave Colonies realized that the action of their Sovereign was a brutal and unwarranted attack upon all of them and their future freedom as a nation and, in consequence whereof they began defensive and offensive action as a whole. ### NEW SUPPLY TRUCK AND SQUAD CAR IN SERVICE

Rheems Fire Company has put into operation a newly-purchased supply truck and squad car.

Fire Chief Max Riceford said the new truck, built for the company by A. W. Stauffer, Terre Hill, will be used to carry company equipment and also as a pick-up truck for firemen answering calls.

When an alarm is sounded, Chief Riceford said, the company pumper will wait for only a small crew of men, and go directly to the fire scene. The new truck will go to the opposite end of Rheems from the fire call, turn around and start toward the fire, picking up all firemen needing a ride to the scene of the blaze. The truck can carry 14 men, including the driver and his assistant.

The new truck is equipped with a 300 gallon tank, carries a portable pump, boots, hats, helmets, hose, gas masks and a stretcher. All this equipment, the chief said, will then be available at the fire scene in case the company pumper is sent to a stream or a plug to pump water.

### DOCTORS-NURSES NAMED FOR 21 COUNTY SECTORS

Each of the County's twenty-one Civil Defense sectors has been assigned a doctor and a key nurse, in the Defense program gradually taking shape here. Besides the key nurses, additional nurses will be available, chosen from the more than 190 nurses who volunteered their services.
