

Stile Still in Style STILES may be old-fashioned, but as

STILES may be old-fashioned, but as long as there are barbed wire fences there will be stiles. Spotted at strategic locations, stiles will save clothing, tempers and walking to a gate. Besides, the fence will last longer.

The stile shown in the illustration is simple to build and easy to climb.

Uprights, made of 1 by 3-inch lumber, should extend 18 inches above the top wire so they may be used as supports wire so they may be used as supports



when climbing over. Each of the crosspieces is 35 inches long cut from lumber of the same dimensions and nailed to the fence post directly above each strand of to the post and the uprights.

To protect the wood, paint the stile. It will last much longer and be safer.





Indianapolis - Inadequate lightning rod protection may kill 400 farmers this summer and cause property damage in the millions of dollars, according to Harry P. Cooper, Jr., secretary of the Na-tional Association of Mutual Insurance Companies.

The Association represents 1,200 farm mutual insurance companies located in all sections of the nation "Most of the losses in lives and property because of lightning are unnecessary," Cooper said. "Experience has proved that proper

lightning rod protection will protect farm buildings against lightning." F-Wire fences are interconnected Cooper explained that lightning rods carry off the stroke when it G-Protection from mechanical hits a building and also preven strokes from occurring.
