the size you need: The one illustrated is large enough for the biggest magazines; it's 12 inches wide and 16 inches high, with a depth of 4 inches.

Both sides and bottom may be cut from a piece of lumber one-half inch thick. Pieces for the slanting top, which has a slight overhang, the front and back may be sawed

from a panel of Masonite 1/8" Tempered Presdwood. Each of these pieces except the front should be

these pieces except the front should be uailed and glued in place so that the box will be waterproof.

The door, pivoted at the bottom, swings out from the top. At the bottom it should be attached to a length of %" half-round. Nails fastened at either end of the half-round through the side pieces will permit the door to pivot. To prevent the door from going too far into the box, attach a small piece of Tempered Presdwood near the top of each side to serve wood near the top of each side to serve as stoppers.

Bore three holes as indicated, each
