**PENN STATE FLOWER GARDENS HIT PEAK**  
 Test flower gardens at the Pennsylvania State College, largest in the nation, are hitting their peak as far as variety and bloom development is concerned, Prof. R. P. Meahl announced. The 835 entries in the annuals garden, each with 50 or more plants, is providing a riot of color for the hundreds of visitors. These gardens will continue to bloom profusely through the middle of August, Prof. Meahl said. Judges for All-America Selections will inspect the test gardens in mid-August. Numerous new entries for All-American Selections also appear in the test rose gardens this year.
