(From page 1) all hospitalized when a car crashed at high speed into a steep embankment on a township road near Manheim yesterday. An 87-year-old motorist struck and injured a 14-year-old boy at Lancaster.

State Police said a driver who fell asleep at the wheel caused a \$1,000 crash at midnight Sunday on the old Harrisburg pike four and a half miles west of Lancaster. Walter Blessing, twenty-one, Salunga, was the driver, according to police, who are continuing their investigation.

Blessing's car swerved across the highway and struck a parked car owned by Oliver Antes, fifty-one, 359 N. West End Ave., Lancaster, shoving Antes car 72 feet along the highway, police said. No one was injured.

Three persons were slightly injured in a truck-auto crash on the Ironville road a mile north of Columbia Saturday, State Police reported.

Treated at Columbia for brush burns and bruises after the crash were Harry B. Dattisman, Jr., forty-two, Salunga; Mrs. Sarah Dattisman, thirty-nine, 465 Manor St., and Edward M. Sager, twenty-one, 335 N. Mary St., Lancaster.

Police said a car operated by the son, Harry B. Dattisman III, seventeen was struck broadside by the truck, driven by Sager and owned by the Hertz Drive-ur-Self System, Lancaster. Police are continuing their investigation.

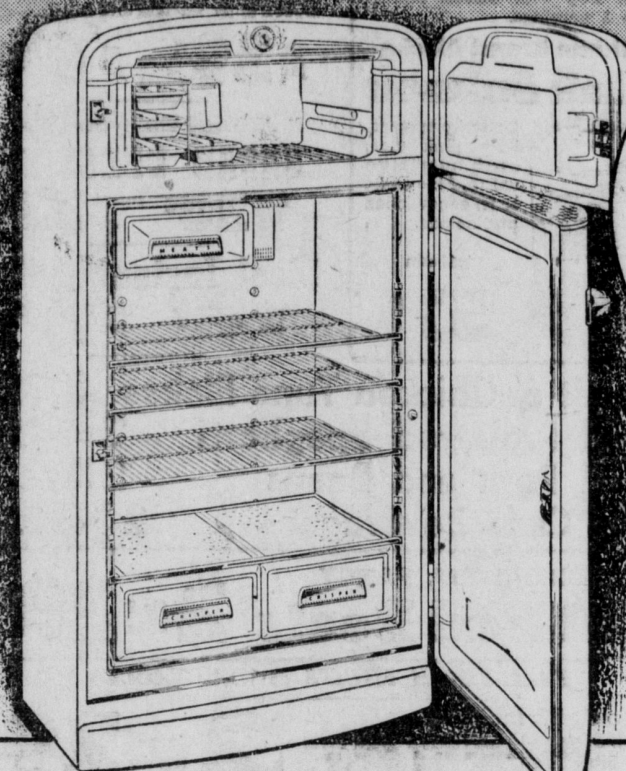
