

The ones illustrated are easily installed and inexpensive. If the shelves are removable, them out and cut saw grooves into which panels of Masonite 1/8-inch tempered



hardboard may be slid. A common alternative is to install commercially available metal mouldings to serve as slides

Note that circular segments are cut from the front edges of the dividers to provide easy access to each space. Homemakers will find the spaces us ful for storing over-size platters, cook-books, large shallow pans and other odd-size pieces of kitchen equipment.
