Supreme Court will not result in less income for the first six months of 1951," Mr. Walls added.

He was commenting on a recent decision by the judges of a U. S. Court in Washington, which, in a two to one decision sustained the 1949 orders of the Federal Power Commission reducing the rates of the Company. A petition for a rehearing has been filed with the court and, if this is denied, a review by the U. S. Supreme Court will be requested, Mr. Walls said.  
Referring to the Company's recently announced \$25,000,000 expansion program, Mr. Walls said: "The Company's Face Rock substation (at its Holtwood, Pennsylvania, hydroelectric and steam generating plant) a 66,000 volt switch yard costing in excess of \$1,000,000 is now substantially complete and is expected to be placed in operation in the early part of September. Construction is also progressing on the Company's 32-mile steel tower 220,000 volt transmission line from near Safe Harbor to the Harrisburg area where connections will be made with utility customers of your Company.  
"The engineering contracts have been signed for the 66,000 kilowatt steam plant addition at Holtwood, designed to triple the Company's steam-generated output, and for the facilities for the recovery and cleaning of anthracite coal dredged from the bed of the Susquehanna River and used as fuel for the expanded steam plant."  
Mr. Walls also reported that negotiations have been carried on with Consolidated Gas Electric Light and Power Company of Baltimore for a new and different long term contractual arrangement for power supply by Penn Water and Safe Harbor Water Power Corporations to the Baltimore utility.

"Your Company and Safe Harbor Company have continued to supply electric power to the Baltimore Co. from their respective plants on the Susquehanna River," Mr. Walls said.
