NEW MORTGAGE RATE WILL BE EFFECTIVE OCT 1st The interest rate of farm mortgage loans financed by the Federal Land Bank of Baltimore will be increased from 4 to 4 1/2 per cent effective Oct. 1, 1951. On present loans and new applications made this month and to the end of September, the current rate of four percent will apply, according to Paul S. Baker, of Landisville, secretary, The National Farm Loan Association of Lancaster.
