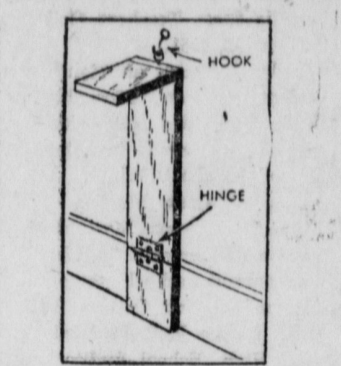

Folding Step in Closet
