**NEW TOWN RECEIVES \$3,000
CHECK TO AID BIBLE STUDY**
Elizabethtown College received
the first annual check for \$3,000 for
the support of its Department of
the Bible, on Saturday.

The check was the first under a
permanent endowment fund estab-
lished Saturday by the Men's Work
Organization of the Eastern District
of Pennsylvania Church of the
Brethren. The endowment fund is
designed eventually to support the
department in full, and calls for
an annual payment to the depart-
ment until that time.

More than 500 members of the
organization met in the Midway
Church. Guest speaker was Prof.
Robert A. Byerly, instructor of the
Bible of Elizabethtown College.
